



A Statute Concerning Tallage (1297)

1297 CHAPTER 1 25 Edw 1

I No Tallage or Aid without Assent of Parliament.

No Tallage or Aid shall be [^{X1}taken] or levied by Us or our Heirs in our Realm, without the good will and Assent of (^{X2}) Archbishops, Bishops, Earls, Barons, Knights, Burgesses, and other [^{X3}Freemen of the Land.]
