## 1932 CHAPTER 9

**N.I.**

An Act to provide for the humane and scientific slaughter of animals; and for purposes connected therewith. [7th June 1932]

### **3 Employment of slaughtermen by local authority. N.I.**

Any local authority which have provided or established a slaughter-house may, if they think fit, employ persons to slaughter or stun animals,<sup>F1</sup>... and may make such charges as they consider reasonable for the services of the persons so employed.

### **9 Interpretation. N.I.**

For the purpose of this Act the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Slaughter-house” means any building, premises or place used in connection with the business of killing animals for the purpose of the flesh being used as butcher's meat;
