## CLOSURE OF PREMISES

#### General

## 37 Offences

- (1) If without reasonable excuse a person remains on or enters premises-
  - (a) in contravention of a closure notice; or
  - (b) in respect of which a closure order has effect,

the person shall be guilty of an offence.

- (2) If a person obstructs an authorised person acting in pursuance of section 31(1) the person shall be guilty of an offence.
- (3) In subsection (2), "authorised person" has the meaning given by section 31(4).
- (4) A person guilty of an offence under subsection (1) or (2) [<sup>F1</sup>shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or to a fine not exceeding the prescribed sum within the meaning of section 225(8) of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995 (c. 46) or to both.]
