**The Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees)
(Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2009**

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972⁽¹⁾ and section 56(1) and (2) of the Finance Act 1973⁽²⁾ and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2009 and come into force on 6th February 2009.

Amendment of the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2005

2. The Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2005⁽³⁾ are amended in accordance with regulations 3 and 4.

Amendment of regulation 2

3. In regulation 2 (interpretation), omit the definition “official body of point of entry”⁽⁴⁾.

The powers in section 2(2) of the 1972 Act are exercised as regards regulation 3 of this instrument. The function conferred upon the Minister of the Crown under section 2(2) in so far as within devolved competence, was transferred to the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998.

The reference to a Government department in section 56(1) is to be read as a reference to the Scottish Administration by virtue of article 2(2) of the Scotland Act (Consequential Modifications) (No. 2) Order 1999 (S.I. 1999/1820) and the functions of the Minister transferred to the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998. The requirement to obtain the consent of the Treasury was removed by section 55 of the Scotland Act 1998.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 (“the principal Regulations”). The principal Regulations implement Article 13d of Council Directive [2000/29/EC](#) on protective measures against the introduction into the Community of organisms harmful to plants or plant products and against their spread within the Community (O.J. No. L 169, 10.7.00, p.1), which requires member States to charge fees to cover the costs occasioned by the documentary checks, identity checks and plant health checks of certain imports of plants, plant products and other objects from third countries.

These Regulations delete a definition in the principal Regulations (regulation 3), and substitute a new Schedule 2 to the principal Regulations (regulation 4), to give effect to the latest agreed reduced rates for inspections of certain material. (Schedule 2 to the principal Regulations includes provision for reduced rates for certain plants and plant products agreed under the procedure provided for in Articles 13d(2) and 18(2) of Directive [2000/29/EC](#).) The changes to the fees made by these Regulations, which are set at a proportion of the standard fee (described in Schedule 1 to the principal Regulations) corresponding to the rate of inspection, are based on the agreed inspection rates set out below:
