

# Public Processions (Northern Ireland) Act 1998

## **1998 CHAPTER 2**

General regulation of public processions

#### 14 Breaking up public procession.

- (1) A person who for the purpose of preventing or hindering any lawful public procession [<sup>F1</sup> or protest meeting]<sup>F1</sup> or of annoying persons taking part in or endeavouring to take part in any such procession [<sup>F1</sup> or protest meeting]<sup>F1</sup>—
  - (a) hinders, molests or obstructs those persons or any of them;
  - (b) acts in a disorderly way towards those persons or any of them; or
  - (c) behaves offensively and abusively towards those persons or any of them,

shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) A person guilty of an offence under subsection (1) shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale, or to both.
