## **PUBLIC HEALTH, ENGLAND**

The Smoke-free (Vehicle Operators and Penalty Notices) Regulations 2007

Made - - - - 7th March 2007

Laid before Parliament 14th March 2007

Coming into force - - 1st July 2007

The Secretary of State for Health, in exercise of the powers in sections 8(3) and 79(3) of, and paragraph 4 of Schedule 1 to, the Health Act 2006(1), makes the following Regulations:—

#### Citation, commencement, application and interpretation

- **1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Smoke-free (Vehicle Operators and Penalty Notices) Regulations 2007 and shall come into force on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2007.
  - (2) These Regulations apply in relation to England only.
  - (3) In these Regulations—

"the Act" means the Health Act 2006; and

"smoke-free vehicle" means a vehicle which is smoke-free by virtue of section 5 of the Act.

#### Failing to prevent smoking in smoke-free vehicles

- **2.** The following persons are under a duty corresponding to that in section 8(1) of the Act to cause any person who is smoking in a smoke-free vehicle to stop smoking—
  - (a) the driver;
  - (b) any person with management responsibilities for the vehicle; and
  - (c) any person on a vehicle who is responsible for order or safety on it.

#### Form of fixed penalty notice

**3.**—(1) The penalty notice form set out in Schedule 1 to these Regulations is specified in relation to the offence of failing to display a no smoking sign in accordance with requirements made by or under section 6 of the Act.

- (2) The penalty notice form set out in Schedule 2 to these Regulations is specified in relation to the offence of smoking in a smoke-free place under section 7 of the Act.
- (3) Where either of those forms refers to the amount of a fixed penalty or to a discounted amount or to a level on the standard scale which is changed, the form shall have effect subject to the change.
- (4) Nothing in this regulation or in Schedule 1 or 2 to these Regulations shall prevent an enforcement authority from—
  - (a) using a notice in a size or design which differs from a specified form, provided that the content of the notice is not changed from that specified in the form (except as permitted by sub-paragraphs (b) to (d));
  - (b) including information or illustrations in a notice to assist a person to whom it is given (for example, information or illustrations on how payments can be made);
  - (c) including information in a notice to assist an enforcement authority in the performance of its functions under section 10(3) of the Act (enforcement) (for example, information to assist in its administrative procedures or data processing); or
  - (d) including coats of arms or logos in a notice.

The amount of the fixed penalty is £200 (two hundred pounds). It must be paid within the 29 day period which is specified in Part 1.

You can pay a discounted amount of £150 (one hundred and fifty pounds) if you pay within the 15 day period specified in Part 1.

If you choose to pay the penalty, no further action will be taken in respect of the alleged offence described at Part 1 of this penalty notice. The payment of the penalty involves no admission of guilt and will not result in a record of criminal conviction being made against you.

Payment may be made by completing Part 3A below and returning it with payment to the address stated in that Part, or by completing Part 3A below and paying in person at *[name and address of enforcement authority]*. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, cheque, postal order or money order.

Cheques, postal orders or money orders should be made payable to [name of enforcement authority]. #### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations made under Chapter 1 of Part 1 of, and Schedule 1 to, the Health Act 2006 contain provisions which relate to smoke-free places (premises and vehicles) in England.

Regulation 2 provides that the driver, any person with management responsibilities for a smoke-free vehicle and any person on a smoke-free vehicle with responsibility for safety or order on that vehicle are each under a duty to cause persons to cease smoking in the vehicle.

Regulation 3 and Schedules 1 and 2 set out fixed penalty forms.

Schedule 1 applies to the offence of failing to display a no smoking sign in accordance with requirements made by or under section 6 of the Act. The maximum penalty on conviction for that offence is a fine of level 3 on the standard scale (at present £1,000), the fixed penalty is £200 and the discounted amount for prompt payment is £150.

Schedule 2 applies to the offence of smoking in a smoke-free place under section 7 of the Act. The maximum penalty on conviction is a fine of level 1 on the standard scale (at present £200), the fixed penalty is £50 and the discounted amount for prompt payment is £30.
