**The Honey (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2005**

*Made* - - - - - *1 November 2005*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *11 November 2005*

The National Assembly for Wales, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 16(1)(e), 17(1), 26(1) and (3) and 48(1) of the Food Safety Act 1990<sup>(1)</sup> and now vested in it<sup>(2)</sup>, having had regard, in accordance with section 48(4A) of that Act to relevant advice given by the Food Standards Agency, and after consultation both as required by Article 9 of Regulation (EC) No. 178/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council<sup>(3)</sup> laying down the general principles and requirements of food law, establishing the European Food Safety Authority and laying down procedures in matters of food safety, hereby makes the following Regulations:

**Title, application and commencement**

1. The title of these Regulations is the Honey (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2005; they apply in relation to Wales and come into force on 11 November 2005.

**Amendments to the Honey Regulations 2003**

2. The Honey (Wales) Regulations 2003<sup>(4)</sup> are amended in accordance with regulation 3.
3. In Schedule 1, Note 1, for the words “and 6” substitute—  
“6 and 7”.
