### **COMMISSION DECISION**

### of 11 June 1976

# relating to the urgent supply of maize as food aid to the Republic of Senegal (Only the French text is authentic)

(76/551/EEC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organization of the market in cereals (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1143/76 (2),

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2750/75 of 29 October 1975 laying down the conditions for the mobilization of cereals as food aid (3), and in particular Article 6 thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2752/75 of 29 October 1975 derogating from Regulation (EEC) No 1693/72 in respect of the procedures laid down for the mobilization of food aid to the countries of the Sahel and Ethiopia (4),

Whereas on 3 March 1975 the Council of the European Communities declared that it proposed, by way of Community action, to grant 7 000 metric tons of maize to the Republic of Senegal under its 1974/75 food-aid programme;

Whereas, in view of the need to provide quick aid, it is necessary to have recourse to contracts by mutual agreement;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Cereals,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

### Article 1

In accordance with Article 1 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2752/75 of 29 October 1975, the Office National Interprofessionel des Céréales (ONIC), Avenue Bosquet, Paris 7<sup>e</sup> (intervention agency) shall conclude a private contract for the

purchase on the Community market of 7 000 metric tons of maize for delivery to the Republic of Senegal.

- In concluding the private contract, ONIC must seek the least onerous terms possible.
- The contract shall be for the purchase and supply of the products delivered to the quay at the port of Dakar.
- The products shall be delivered in new 50 kg jute sacks in two parts of 3 500 metric tons each.

The sacks shall be marked by printing:

'Maïs — Don de la Communauté économique européenne à la République du Senegal.'

#### Article 2

The product referred to in Article 1 must be of fair and sound merchantable quality and correspond at least to the standard quality for which the intervention price is fixed.

If the product does not meet these requirements it shall be refused.

# Article 3

- A security of a value of five units of account per metric ton shall be given by the party concerned on the signature of the contract. It shall be released on the completion of the operations in question within the time limit laid down and also for those quantities not realised due to force majeure.
- The security provided for in paragraph 1 may be given in the form of a cash deposit or of a guarantee issued by a credit institution conforming to the criteria laid down by the Member State.

#### Article 4

Shipment shall be carried out between 1 and 15 July 1976.

# Article 5

The intervention agency shall request the interested party to specify the following information:

- (a) after each shipment, a statement giving details of the quantities loaded, the quality of the products and their packaging;
- (b) the date of the departure of the ships; the expected date of arrival of the products at their destination;
- (c) all possible contingencies which might occur during transportation of the products.

The intervention agency shall transmit the information provided for to the Commission as soon as it is received together with a copy of the private contract.

# Article 6

This Decision is addressed to the French Republic.
