

## REGULATION (EEC) No 1755/71 OF THE COMMISSION

of 10 August 1971

establishing Community surveillance over imports of urea from Yugoslavia

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1025/70<sup>1</sup> of 25 May 1970 establishing common rules for imports from third countries, and in particular Articles 7 and 8 thereof;

After consultation with the Committee provided for in Article 5 of that Regulation;

Whereas imports of urea, sub-heading No 29.25 A I of the Common Customs Tariff, into the Community from Yugoslavia have recently increased considerably and have been effected at relatively low prices;

Whereas, given the general market situation as regards the product in question, these imports threaten to cause injury to Community producers of like products;

Whereas, this being so, the interests of the Community call for Community surveillance over such imports, by means of the import document

provided for in Article 8 of Regulation (EEC) No 1025/70, which document may appropriately be accompanied by a certificate of origin;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

*Article 1*

The importation of urea, sub-heading No 29.25 A I of the Common Customs Tariff, into the Community from Yugoslavia shall, in accordance with the procedures provided for in Regulation (EEC) No 1025/70, be made subject to Community surveillance.

*Article 2*

The import document shall be valid for a maximum period of four months.

*Article 3*

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*. It shall apply from 1 September 1971.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
