REGULATION (EEC) No 2313/72 OF THE COMMISSION  
of 30 October 1972

amending Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1570/70 of 3 August 1970  
establishing a system of standard average values for citrus fruits

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 803/68<sup>1</sup> of 27 June 1968 on the valuation of goods for customs purposes, and in particular Article 13 thereof;

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1570/70<sup>2</sup> of 3 August 1970, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2100/72<sup>3</sup> of 29 September 1972, established a system of standard average values for citrus fruits; whereas experience gained since then shows that certain amendments are necessary;

Whereas the classification shown in the Annex to the latter Regulation groups nearly all the citrus fruits to which the system of standard average values applies by origin and, in a number of cases, by variety also;

Whereas the 'sweet oranges' of Group 2 are classified by nine different origins, four of these being subdivided by variety; whereas, moreover, three of these classifications by origin are subdivided in the same way by variety, the other being subdivided into two groups of varieties;

Whereas the experience gained in the course of the 1970/71 and 1971/72 importing seasons has shown that, for comparable varieties originating in countries on the Mediterranean seaboard, the marketing periods are almost identical and the prices obtained, once the

market has been stabilized, are very much the same;

Whereas, that being so, it is possible to regroup the origins while maintaining the subdivision into three main groups of varieties; whereas such a change would take account of practical requirements and at the same time make it possible to determine and apply standard average values reflecting the normal price defined in Article 1 of Regulation (EEC) No 803/68; whereas it would be appropriate to publish the new classification of citrus fruits for the establishment of standard average values as an Annex to the present Regulation;

Whereas the provisions of this Regulation are in accordance with the Opinion of the Customs Valuation Committee;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

*Article 1*

The classification annexed to this Regulation shall be substituted for the classification of citrus fruits shown in the Annex to Regulation (EEC) No 1570/70 of 3 August 1970, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2100/72 of 29 September 1972.

*Article 2*

This Regulation shall enter into force on 3 November 1972.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
