

**REGULATION (EEC) No 1089/73 OF THE COMMISSION**  
of 26 April 1973  
**fixing sluice-gate prices and levies for poultrymeat**

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation No 123/67/EEC<sup>(1)</sup> of 13 June 1967 on the common organization of the market in poultrymeat, as last amended by the Act<sup>(2)</sup> annexed to the Treaty<sup>(3)</sup> concerning the Accession of new Member States to the European Economic Community and the European Atomic Energy Community, signed at Brussels on 22 January 1972, and in particular Articles 3 and 7 (1) thereof;

Whereas the sluice-gate prices and levies for the products referred to in Article 1 (1) of Regulation No 123/67/EEC must be fixed quarterly in advance in accordance with the calculation methods laid down in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1537/72<sup>(4)</sup> of 18 July 1972 fixing sluice-gate prices and levies for poultrymeat;

Whereas sluice-gate prices and levies for poultrymeat were last fixed by Regulation (EEC) No 202/73<sup>(5)</sup> for the period from 1 February 1973 to 30 April 1973 and whereas new prices and levies must be fixed for the period from 1 May 1973 to 31 July 1973; whereas these prices should be fixed in principle on the basis of prices for feed grain for the period from 1 August 1972 to 31 January 1973;

Whereas, when the sluice-gate prices applicable from 1 November, 1 February and 1 May are being fixed, trends in world market prices for feed grain shall be taken into account only if the price of the quantity of feed grain shows a minimum variation from that used in calculating the sluice-gate price for the preceding quarter; whereas Council Regulation No 146/67/EEC<sup>(6)</sup> of 21 June 1967 fixing the rules for calculating the levy and the sluice-gate price for poultrymeat, as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 988/73<sup>(7)</sup>, fixed this variation at 3 %;

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

Done at Brussels, 26 April 1973.

Whereas the price of the quantity of feed grain varies by more than 3 % from that used for the preceding quarter; whereas this trend must therefore be taken into account in fixing the sluice-gate price for the period from 1 May 1973 to 31 July 1973;

Whereas, when the levies applicable from 1 November, 1 February and 1 May are being fixed, trends in world market prices for feed grain shall be taken into account only if at the same time a new sluice-gate price is being fixed;

Whereas new sluice-gate prices are being fixed and levies must consequently be fixed taking into account the trend in price for feed grain;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the Opinion of the Management Committee for Poultrymeat and Eggs;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

*Article 1*

1. The levies provided for in Article 3 of Regulation No 123/67/EEC and the sluice-gate prices provided for in Article 7 thereof for the products referred to in Article 1 (1) of that Regulation are specified in the Annex.

2. However, for products falling within heading No 02.03 and subheading Nos 15.01 B and 16.02 B I of the Common Customs Tariff, in respect of which the rate of duty has been bound within GATT, the levies shall be limited to the amount resulting from that binding.

*Article 2*

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 May 1973.
