REGULATION (EEC) No 1882/75 OF THE COMMISSION of 23 July 1975

fixing the compensatory amounts for eggs

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty of Accession (1);

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 237/73 (2) of 31 January 1973 laying down general rules for the system of compensatory amounts for eggs, as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2880/73 (3), and in particular Article 9 (2) thereof;

Whereas compensatory amounts for eggs were fixed for the period until 31 July 1975 by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2518/74 (4) of 4 October 1974;

Whereas the compensatory amounts applicable from 1 August 1975 for eggs in shell are to be calculated on the basis of the compensatory amounts fixed for these products in Regulation (EEC) No 237/73 and by reference to the variation in the compensatory amounts applicable for the quantity of feed grain required in the Community to produce one kilogramme of eggs in shell or hatching eggs;

Whereas the compensatory amounts applicable in respect of the same period for other egg products must be derived from the compensatory amount for eggs in shell other than hatching eggs by means of the coefficients fixed by Commission Regulation No 164/67/EEC (5) of 26 June 1967 fixing the factors for calculating levies and sluice-gate prices for derived egg products, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1775/74 (6);

Whereas the compensatory amounts for ovalbumin and lactalbumin must be derived from the said compensatory amount by means of the coefficients fixed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1777/74 (7) of 9 July 1974 fixing the value of certain items to be used in calculating the import duties and sluice-gate prices for ovalbumin and lactalbumin;

Whereas the calculation of the compensatory amounts for trade with Denmark results in minimal amounts; whereas, therefore, in accordance with Article 55 (4) of the Act of Accession, no compensatory amounts should be fixed for that country;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the Opinion of the Management Committee for Poultrymeat and Eggs,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The compensatory amounts for egg products, ovalbumin and lactalbumin applicable from 1 August 1975 until 31 July 1976 in trade between the Community as originally constituted and the new Member States, and between those States and third countries, shall be as shown in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 August 1975.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
