Page 18, Article 13 (6), second subparagraph of Regulation (EEC) No 997/81:

for: 'Member States may prescribe

- in respect of the use of the terms referred to in (b) and (c) of the first subparagraph in the case of certain quality wines psr obtained in their territory, the minimum total acidity as an additional analysis criterion.
- in respect of the use of the terms referred to in (d) of the first subparagraph, a minimum residual sugar content of not less than 35 grams per litre, provided that such a requirement is laid down in the national provisions governing production.'

read: 'Member States may prescribe

- in respect of the use of the terms referred to in (b) and (c) of the first subparagraph, the minimum total acidity as an additional analysis criterion.
- in respect of the use of the terms referred to in (d) of the first subparagraph in the case of certain quality wines psr obtained in their territory, a minimum residual content of not less than 35 grams per litre, prodived that such a requirement is laid down in the national provisions governing production.'
