An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers, of Two Acts, made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of King George the Second and the Nineteenth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from the City of Carlisle to the Town of Penrith, in the County of Cumberland, and from the said Town of Penrith to Emont Bridge, which divides the Counties of Cumberland and Westmorland.

[10th May 1798.]

HEREAS Two Acts were made, in the Twenty-fixth Year of Preamble. the Reign of King George the Second, and the Nineteenth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from the City of Carlisle to the Town of Penrith, in the County of Cumberland, and from the said Town of Penrith to Emont Bridge, which divides the Counties of Cumberland and Westmoreland: And whereas the Trustees for the Care of the said Roads have proceeded in the Execution of the said Acts, and have borrowed several Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls thereby granted, which still remain due, and cannot be paid off, and the said Roads effectually amended and kept in Repair, unless the Loc. & Per.

Term of former Acts continued.

Term of the faid Acts be further continued, and some of the Powers thereof altered and enlarged: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Acts, and the several Clauses, Tolls, Powers, Exemptions, Penalties, Forseitures, Matters, and Things therein contained, and which are now in Force (except such as relate to Exemptions from Stamp Duties, and also such as are hereby varied or altered) and also this present Act, shall be, and are hereby declared to be in full Force and Effect, and shall have Continuance for and during the further Term herein-after mentioned, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purpoles, as if the same were herein particularly inserted, repeated, and re-enacted, but subject nevertheless to the Amendments, Alterations, Variations, and Additions herein contained; and that this Act, and the additional Term hereby granted, shall be subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies now due and owing, or which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the faid recited Acts and this present Act, and of all Interest due or to grow due thereon respectively.

II. For creating an additional Toll House,

III. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees appointed by virtue and in pursuance of the said recited Acts and ec. at or near of this Act, or any Seven or more of them, and they are hereby empow-Plumpton Head. ered to build and erect, or cause to be built and erected, an additional Toll House, and likewise a Turnpike or Toll Gate, at or near Plumpton Head, and thereat to demand, take, and receive such and the like Tolls as are by the faid recited Acts, or either of them, granted and made payable at the Turnpike or Toll Gate on Wragmire Causeway; and also to erect or

cause to be erected a Wall, and to make a Ditch from the said Turnpike or Toll Gate at or near Plumpton Head, to Bowsfearr, provided that sufficient Openings are lest in the said Wall for Sheep to pass and re-pass through the fame; and if any Person or Persons shall wilfully or maliciously pull down or damage any Part of the faid Wall, or shall fill in or spoil any fuch Ditch, every Person so offending shall, on being convicted of such Offence, forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, One Moiety whereof shall be paid to the Informer, to be recovered in such Manner as the Penalties and Forfeitures imposed by the faid first-recited Act are directed to be recovered.

faid Turnpike or Toll Gate to be erected at or near Plumpton Head for any from Toll. Horses, Black Cattle, or Sheep, belonging to any Person or Persons in the Parishes of Heskett, Lazonby, and Penrith, having Right of Common in and upon the Commons or Waste Grounds belonging to any of the said Parishes, which shall be going to or returning from Pasture on the said Commons or Waste Grounds, or for the Owner or Owners thereof who may be in Search of the fame; and that the Owners or Drivers of all Black Cattle and Sheep, which may have Occasion to go through the said Turnpike or Toll Gate, shall, on producing a Ticket from the Turnpike or Toll Gate on Wragmire Causeway, within Twenty-four Hours from the Date thereof, be permitted to pass with the said Cattle and Sheep Toll free; but in case no such Ticket shall be produced, then the said Cattle and Sheep shall be subject and liable to the Payment of One Half of the Tolls granted by the faid recited Act of the Twenty fixth Year of King George the Second: Provided also, That the Owners or Drivers of all Coaches, Chaifes, Landaus, Waggons, Carts, and other Carriages, and Persons with Horses, shall, on producing a Ticket from either of the

IV. Provided always, That no Toll shall be demanded or taken at the Exemptions

V. And be it further enacted, That the Owner or Driver of any Cart, Carriages re-Wain, Waggon, or other Carriage, going from the Town of Penrith, turning with and the Neighbourhood thereof, for the Purpose of fetching Coals for the Toil free. Use of the Inhabitants of the said Town and Neighbourhood, shall, on producing a Ticket, fignifying his having paid Toll the preceding Day for the same Cart, Wain, Waggon, or othe. Carriage, be permitted to repass with such Carriage through the said Turnpike or Toll Gate at or near Plumpton Head Toll free.

Turnpikes or Toll Gates at or near Plumpton Head or Wragmire Causeway,

be permitted to pass through the other Turnpike Toll free.

VI. And be it further enaced, That the Charges and Expences incident Expences of to, and attending the obtaining and puffing of this Act, shall be paid by this Act, the faid Trustees, or any Five or more of them, out of the Money already collected or borrowed, or to be collected or borrowed by virtue of the laid recited Acts and this Act, in Preference to any other Payment whatfoever.

VII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be adjudged, deemed, Publick Ace and taken to be a Publick A&, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as fuch, by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons whomsoever, without specially pleading the fame.

Commence ment and Continuance of this Act.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take place upon the Third Wednefday next after the passing thereof, and, together with so much of the said recited Acts as by this Act is not varied or altered, shall continue in Force for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
