Housing Subsidy Order

ORDER, DATED 15TH MARCH 1974, MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING, LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND PLANNING, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE HOUSING (NO. 2) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946.

The Department of Housing, Local Government and Planning (in this Order referred to as "the Department") with the approval of the Department of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Department by section 1 of the Housing (No. 2) Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Housing Subsidy (Variation) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 and shall be construed as one with the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(b).

2. In its application to a housing scheme in respect of which the tender has been submitted for approval to the Department by the Northern Ireland Housing Executive or accepted by a Housing Association after 15th March 1974, the Housing Subsidy Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 shall be amended by substituting for the Schedule therein the Schedule to this Order.
