**Coroners (Salaries, Fees and Expenses) (Amendment) (No. 3) Rules
(Northern Ireland) 1975**

Made 3rd October 1975

Coming into operation 3rd November 1975

To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State(a), in pursuance of section 36(1)(a) of the Coroners Act (Northern Ireland) 1959(b) read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(c) and after consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service(d), hereby makes the following rules:

Citation and commencement

1. These rules may be cited as the Coroners (Salaries, Fees and Expenses) (Amendment) (No. 3) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1975 and shall come into operation on 3rd November 1975 and shall have effect as from 14th July 1975.

Fee payable for making post-mortem examination

2. Rule 6 of the Coroners (Salaries, Fees and Expenses) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1971(e) shall be amended by substituting the amount "£12.61" for the amount "£9.68".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the rules but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These rules provide for an increase in the fee payable to a registered medical practitioner on the list approved by the Secretary of State under section 26 of the Act, not being one employed by the Secretary of State under section 27(2), who makes a post-mortem examination of a body by the Coroner's direction or at the Coroner's request and reports the result thereof to the Coroner.

The rules have retrospective effect as from 14th July 1975 by virtue of section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962.
