DANGEROUS DRUGS**Misuse of Drugs (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland)
1975***Made* 21st November 1975*Coming into operation* 29th December 1975

The Department of Health and Social Services in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 7, 10 and 31 of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971(a) as adapted by section 38 of the Act and now vested in it(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and after consultation with the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs, hereby makes the following regulations:

1. These regulations may be cited as the Misuse of Drugs (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975 and shall come into operation on 29th December 1975.

2.—(1) In these regulations, “the principal regulations” means the Misuse of Drugs (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1974(c).

(2) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954(d) shall apply to these regulations as it applies to a Measure of the Northern Ireland Assembly.

3. Schedule 1 to the principal regulations shall be amended as follows:

(a) After paragraph 4, there shall be inserted the following paragraph:

“4A. Any preparation of propiram containing per dosage unit, not more than 100 milligrams of propiram calculated as base and compounded with at least the same amount by weight of methyl-cellulose.”;

(b) in paragraph 6, for the words “(including paragraph 3A)” there shall be substituted the words “(including paragraphs 3A and 4A)”.
