JUDGMENTS (ENFORCEMENT)**Judgment Enforcement (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations
(Northern Ireland) 1975***Made* 21st November 1975*Coming into operation* 1st January 1976*To be laid before Parliament*

The Secretary of State(a) in pursuance of section 118 of the Judgments (Enforcement) Act (Northern Ireland) 1969(b) hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Judgment Enforcement (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1976.

Amendment of 1970 Regulations

2. The provisions of the Judgment Enforcement (Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1970(c) specified in the first column of the Schedule are amended to the extent specified in the second column thereof.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations amend the Judgment Enforcement (Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1970 by altering the fees and expenses payable to auctioneers and valuers upon a sale of property seized upon the enforcement of a judgment by the Enforcement of Judgments Office and by increasing the fees payable on application for or in matters relating to such enforcement.
