The Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976

Made 16th August 1976 Coming into operation 1st October 1976

The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 17(2)(a) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976, shall be read as one with the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975(b) and shall come into operation on 1st October 1976.

Amendment of regulation 7 of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975

- 2. Regulation 7 of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975 (days not to be treated as days of unemployment or incapacity for work) shall be amended by the insertion, after sub-paragraph (k) of paragraph (1) of that regulation, of the following sub-paragraph:
 - "(l) a day shall not be treated as a day of unemployment in relation to any person if it is a day in respect of which there is payable to that person-
 - (i) an amount specified by an industrial tribunal, on making an order under Article 31 or 39 of the Industrial Relations (Northern Ireland) Order 1976(c) for reinstatement or re-engagement, as payable to that person or an amount awarded to that person under Article 32 or 41 of that Order as compensation for unfair dismissal or for non-compliance with an order under Article 39(7), (8) or (9) of that Order, where either of those amounts includes a sum representing remuneration which the industrial tribunal considers he might reasonably be expected to have had for that day but for the dismissal, so however that this provision shall not apply to any day which does not fall within the period of one year from the date on which the employment of that person terminated: or

- (ii) an amount specified by an industrial tribunal, on making an order under Article 39 or 41 of the Industrial Relations (Northern Ireland) Order 1976 for interim relief pending determination of a claim for unfair dismissal, as payable to that person by way of pay in respect of a pay period which includes that day; or
- (iii) remuneration under a protective award made under Article 51 of the Industrial Relations (Northern Ireland) Order 1976 or an amount ordered to be paid under Article 53 of that Order.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations amend the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975 so as to provide that a day, in respect of which there is payable to a person certain payments to which Article 72 of the Industrial Relations (Northern Ireland) Order 1976 applies, shall not be treated as a day of unemployment for the purposes of entitlement to unemployment benefit.
