SOCIAL SECURITY**The Social Security (Canada) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977***Made* 15th November 1977*Coming into operation* 15th November 1977

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 134(a) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(b), as that section is amended by section 20(3) of, and as that section is extended by section 20(4) of, the Social Security (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1977(c), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This order, which may be cited as the Social Security (Canada) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977, shall be read as one with the Family Allowances and National Insurance (Canada) Order (Northern Ireland) 1960(d) and shall come into operation on 15th November 1977.

(2) Any reference in this order to any provision made by, or contained in, any enactment or instrument shall, except insofar as the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to that provision as amended or extended by any enactment or instrument, and as including a reference to any provision which it re-enacts or replaces, or which may re-enact or replace it, with or without modification.

(3) The rules for the construction of Acts of Parliament contained in the Interpretation Act 1889(e) shall apply for the purposes of the interpretation of this order as they apply for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Modification of Act and Variation of Order

2. The Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975 shall be modified and the Family Allowances and National Insurance (Canada) Order (Northern Ireland) 1960 shall be varied to such extent as may be required to give effect to the provisions contained in the Letters set out in the Schedule to this order, so far as the same relate to Northern Ireland.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

Letters exchanged on 11th November 1977 between the High Commissioner for the United Kingdom in Canada and the Canadian Minister of Health and Welfare

No. 1

The High Commissioner for the United Kingdom in Canada to the Canadian Minister of Health and Welfare

11th November 1977

1. As you know, our officials have been considering whether the arrangements concerning social security agreed in the letters which passed between the Governments of the United Kingdom and Canada on 8th and 10th December 1959, as amended by the exchanges of letters of 7th and 30th November 1961 and 9th March 1973 require to be modified in view of the recent changes made in Canadian Social Security Legislation.

2. The Government of the United Kingdom now proposes that:—

- (a) In respect of persons who have been awarded a retirement pension under the legislation of the United Kingdom commencing before 1st July 1977 by reliance in whole or in part on the provisions of paragraph 16 of Sir Saville Garner's letter of 8th December 1959 (which, in certain circumstances, enable persons to be treated as having paid contributions under British legislation for weeks of residence in Canada), and who on or after 1st July 1977 are in receipt of an old age security pension under the legislation of Canada, the weekly rate of that retirement pension which, but for the provisions of this paragraph, would be payable shall, with effect from 15th November 1977 or the first day of payment of the old age security pension, whichever is later, be reduced by a sum equal to the weekly rate of that old age security pension payable in respect of the first week of payment as converted into the sterling equivalent at the rate of exchange obtaining on the first day of that week. Revision of the amount of reduction shall be on the first or only date in every year, beginning on or after 1st January 1978, on which the said retirement pension under the legislation of the United Kingdom is increased in accordance with an up-rating order, and the amount of reduction shall be a sum equal to the weekly rate of the said old age security pension payable in respect of the week in which that day falls as converted into the sterling equivalent at the rate of exchange obtaining on that day. The provisions of this sub-paragraph shall not however operate so as to reduce the aggregate of pensions payable to an amount less than the amount of retirement pension which would have been payable under the legislation of the United Kingdom but for those provisions.
- (b) In respect of persons who, on or after 1st July 1977, are or have been awarded a retirement pension under the legislation of the United Kingdom by virtue of the provisions of the said paragraph 16, and who on a day falling after 30th June 1977 either are in receipt of an old age security pension under the legislation of Canada or have lived in Canada for 20 or more years in aggregate since age 18, the provisions of the said paragraph 16 shall not apply with effect from that day or 15th November 1977, whichever is the later.

3. The Government of the United Kingdom proposes that the Government of Canada shall provide the Government of the United Kingdom with information as to claimants resident in the United Kingdom in receipt of benefits under the Old Age Security Act, and that the Government of the United Kingdom shall provide the Government of Canada with information as to claimants resident in Canada in receipt of retirement pension under the legislation of the United Kingdom.

4. The Government of the United Kingdom proposes that this modification of the arrangements to which I have referred shall enter into force on 15th November 1977 and shall thereafter be treated as if it were part of those arrangements.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
