The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1978

Made 20th July 1978

Coming into operation 13th November 1978

The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in conjunction with the Department of Finance for Northern Ireland(a), in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 120 of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(b), as extended by Article 25 of the Social Security Pensions (Northern Ireland) Order 1975(c), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order: which order corresponds to the order(d) made by the Secretary of State for Social Services under section 124 of the Social Security Act 1975(e):

Citation, interpretation and commencement

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1978 and shall, subject to Articles 3 and 4 below, come into operation on 13th November 1978.

(2) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires, "the Act" means the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975.

(3) The rules for the construction of Acts of Parliament contained in the Interpretation Act 1889(f) shall apply in relation to this instrument and in relation to the revocation effected by it as if this instrument and the order so revoked were Acts of Parliament and as if the revocation were a repeal.

Alterations in rates or amounts of certain benefits under the Act

2.—(1) In this Article, "Schedule 4" means Schedule 4 to the Act, as amended by Article 23(1) and (2) of, and Schedules 4 and 5 to, the Child Benefit (Northern Ireland) Order 1975(g), by the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1977(h), and by the Social Security (Mobility Allowance) Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1978(i).

(2) The sums specified in paragraph (3)(a) below shall be altered from and including the respective dates specified in Article 3 below; the sums specified in paragraph (3)(b) below shall be altered from and including 2nd April 1979; and Schedule 4 shall accordingly have effect as set out in the Schedule to this order.

(3) The sums mentioned in paragraph (2) above are—

- (a) the sums specified in Parts I, III, IV and V of Schedule 4 (contributory periodical benefits, non-contributory periodical benefits, increases for dependants and rate or amount of industrial injuries benefit respectively), reduced where appropriate by the Child Benefit and Social Security (Fixing and Adjustment of Rates) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976(j), as amended(k), except the sums specified in the said Part III for mobility allowance and age addition; and
- (b) the sums specified in paragraph 10 of Part I, paragraph 4 of Part III, Part IV, and paragraphs 9, 10 and 15 of Part V of Schedule 4 (child's special allowance, guardian's allowance, increase of benefit for dependants, increase of injury benefit for dependent children, increase of disablement pension for dependent children and industrial death benefit by way of an allowance in respect of children respectively).

Dates on which sums specified for rates or amounts of benefit under the Act are altered by this order

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (7) of this Article, the alterations made by this order in the sums specified for rates or amounts of benefit under the Act shall take effect for each case on the date specified in relation to such case in the following provisions of this Article.

(2) In relation to the case of a person over pensionable age who has not retired from regular employment and for whom the rate of unemployment benefit, sickness benefit or invalidity benefit falls to be calculated in accordance with section 14(6) or 15(4) of the Act, the alteration in the sum specified in Schedule 4 to the Act for the rate of Category A or B retirement pension (including where appropriate increases for dependants), shall take effect on 16th November 1978 and in relation to all other cases the alteration in such sum shall take effect on 13th November 1978.

(3) The sums specified for the rate of maternity allowance, widow's and widowed mother's allowance, widow's pension, Category C and D retirement pension, child's special allowance, attendance allowance, invalid care allowance (except in a case where the Department has made arrangements for it to be paid on a Wednesday), guardian's allowance and industrial death benefit by way of widow's and widower's pension and allowance in respect of children (including where appropriate increases for dependants), shall be altered in all cases with effect from 13th November 1978.

(4) The sums specified for the rate of invalid care allowance (in a case where the Department has made arrangements for it to be paid on a Wednesday), disablement benefit (including increases of disablement pension), maximum disablement gratuity under section 57(5) of the Act, increase of unemployability supplement under section 59 of the Act and maximum under section 91(1) of the Act of aggregate of weekly benefit payable for successive accidents, shall be altered in all cases with effect from 15th November 1978.

(5) In relation to the case of a person whose weekly rate of Category A or B retirement pension falls to be increased under the provisions of section 28(7) or 29(8) or (11) of the Act by reference to the weekly rate of invalidity allowance to which he was previously entitled, the alteration in the sum specified for the rate of invalidity allowance shall take effect on 13th November 1978 and in relation to all other cases the alteration in such sum shall take effect on 16th November 1978.

(6) The alteration in the sum specified for the rate of unemployment and sickness benefit, invalidity pension, non-contributory invalidity pension and injury benefit (including where appropriate increases for dependants), shall take effect in all cases on 16th November 1978.

(7) In the case of a person to whom injury benefit under the Act is payable for 15th November 1978 at a reduced weekly rate by virtue of the provisions of section 91(1) of the Act (aggregate of weekly benefit payable for successive accidents), the rate of that benefit or of any sickness benefit or invalidity pension under the Act shall be determined as if the alteration in the rates of those benefits took effect on 15th November 1978 and, where appropriate, as if the reference to 16th November 1978 in paragraph (2) of this Article were a reference to 15th November 1978.

Increases in rates of certain benefits under the Industrial Injuries and Diseases (Northern Ireland Old Cases) Act 1975

4. With effect from and including 15th November 1978, for "£10.50" there shall be substituted "£11.70" in section 2(6)(c) of the Industrial Injuries and Diseases (Northern Ireland Old Cases) Act 1975(1) (maximum weekly rate of lesser incapacity allowance supplementing workmen's compensation), as amended by the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1977.

Increase in rate of graduated retirement benefit

5. In the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(m) the sum of 2½ pence referred to in section 35(1) (graduated retirement benefit) shall be increased by 3.6 per cent.; and from and including 13th November 1978 the reference in that provision to that sum shall accordingly have effect as a reference to 2.59 pence.

Increase of amount specified in sections 30(1), 45(3) and 66(4) of the Act

6. The amount specified in sections 30(1), 45(3) and 66(4) of the Act, excluding paragraphs (a) and (b) of those provisions (amount of weekly earnings which must be exceeded before certain benefits are reduced by reference to earnings) shall be increased to £45.

Increase of sum specified in Article 8(1)(a) of the Social Security Pensions (Northern Ireland) Order 1975

7. With effect from 13th November 1978 for "£17.50" there shall be substituted "£19.50" in Article 8(1)(a) of the Social Security Pensions (Northern Ireland) Order 1975 (weekly rate of basic component of Category A retirement pension).

Revocation

8. The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1977 is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This order, which corresponds to an order made by the Secretary of State for Social Services under section 124 of the Social Security Act 1975, alters with effect from specified dates in the week beginning 13th November 1978 the rates and amounts of the benefits and increases of benefit (except age addition and mobility allowance) specified in Parts I, III, IV and V of Schedule 4. to the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975. It also increases the maximum weekly rate of lesser incapacity allowance supplementing workmen's compensation laid down in the Industrial Injuries and Diseases (Northern Ireland Old Cases) Act 1975, the amount, specified in the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975. Further the order increases the amount of weekly earnings specified in the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975 which must be exceeded before certain benefits are reduced by reference to earnings, and the weekly rate of the basic component of a Category A retirement pension payable under the Social Security Pensions (Northern Ireland) Order 1975.

The order reduces the weekly rates of benefits and increases of benefits under the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975 payable in respect of children with effect from 2nd April 1979, on which date an increase in the rate of child benefit is provided for by the Child Benefit (Fixing and Adjustment of Rates) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978.

The order also revokes the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1977.
