LEGAL AID AND ADVICE

Legal Aid (Financial Conditions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979

Made 13th May 1979

Coming into operation 15th June 1979

To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State in pursuance of sections 2 and 3 of the Legal Aid and Advice Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(a), hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation, Commencement and Interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Legal Aid (Financial Conditions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979 and shall come into operation on 15th June 1979.

(2) In these regulations

“the Act” means the Legal Aid and Advice Act (Northern Ireland) 1965;

“the 1978 Regulations” means the Legal Aid (Financial Conditions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978(b).

Disposable income for the purposes of, and limit of disposable capital under Section 2 of the Act

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of section 2(1) of the Act, legal aid shall be available to any person whose disposable income does not exceed £3,600 a year, instead of the amount prescribed under that subsection by regulation 2(1) of the 1978 regulations.

(2) For the purposes of section 2(1) of the Act, a person may be refused legal aid if he has a disposable capital of more than £2,500 instead of the amount prescribed by regulation 2(2) of the 1978 regulations.

Contribution to the Legal Aid Fund

3.—(1) A person's contribution to the Legal Aid Fund in respect of any proceedings may include a contribution in respect of income not greater than one-third of the amount (if any) by which his disposable income exceeds £1,500 a year instead of the amount prescribed under section 3(1)(a) of the Act by regulation 3(1) of the 1978 regulations.

(2) For the purposes of section 3(1)(b) of the Act a person's contribution to the Legal Aid Fund may include a contribution in respect of capital not greater than the amount (if any) by which his disposable capital exceeds £1,200 instead of the amount prescribed by regulation 3(2) of the 1978 regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport)

These regulations increase the financial limits for legal aid.

The income limits are increased to make legal aid available to those with incomes (after certain deductions) of not more than £3,600 a year (instead of £2,600) and available without payment of a contribution to those with incomes (after deductions) of not more than £1,500 a year (instead of £815).

The capital limits are increased to make the upper limit of disposable capital, above which a person may be refused legal aid, £2,500 (instead of £1,700) and the lower limit of disposable capital, below which no contribution in respect of capital may be required, £1,200 (instead of £365).
