WAGES COUNCILS

Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1979

Made 25th June 1979
Coming into operation 9th July 1979

The Department of Manpower Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), and now vested in it(b), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Council (Northern Ireland).

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means 9th July 1979, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

The Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(c) (Order N.I.B.S. (110)), as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975(d) (Order N.I.B.S. (125)) and the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1978(e) (Order N.I.B.S. (131)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto—

1. for paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 13, 30 and 32 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—

OVERTIME—ALL WORKERS

Paragraph 30.

Overtime rates are payable as follows:—

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| (1) on any day other than a Sunday or customary holiday or a day on which a rest period occurs, for all time worked in excess of 8 hours | TIME-AND-A-HALF |
| (2) in any week, for all time worked during rest periods | TIME-AND-A-HALF |
| (3) on Sunday or customary holiday, for all time worked | DOUBLE TIME |
| (4) in any week, for all time worked in excess of 40 hours, exclusive of any time for which a minimum rate is payable under the foregoing provisions of this paragraph | TIME-AND-A-HALF |

Paragraph 32.

For the purpose of paragraph 30, the expressions "time-and-a-half" and "double time" mean respectively—

- (a) in the case of a time worker, one and a half times and twice the hourly general minimum time rate otherwise applicable to the worker,
- (b) in the case of a worker employed on piece work—
 - (i) a time rate equal to one half and the whole of the hourly general minimum time rate which would be applicable to the worker if he were a time worker and a minimum overtime rate did not apply, and in addition thereto,
 - (ii) the minimum remuneration otherwise applicable to the worker under paragraph 16.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 9th July 1979, amends the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 (Order N.I.B.S. (110)) as amended by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975 (Order N.I.B.S. (125)) and the Boot and Shoe Repairing Wages Regulation (Amendment Order (Northern Ireland) 1978 (Order N.I.B.S. (131)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
