SOCIAL SECURITY**The Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979***Made* 14th March 1979*Coming into operation* 13th April 1979

The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 76(2) and (4) and 77(2) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation, interpretation and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979, shall be read as one with the Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977(b), (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") and shall come into operation on 13th April 1979.

Amendment of regulation 2 of the principal regulations

2. In regulation 2 of the principal regulations (prescription of diseases and injuries and occupations for which they are prescribed) the following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (c):

"(c) byssinosis is prescribed in relation to all persons who have been employed in employed earner's employment at any time on or after 5th July 1948 in any occupation in any room where any process up to and including the winding or beaming process is performed in factories in which the spinning or manipulation of raw or waste cotton or of flax is carried on."

Transitional provisions

3.—(1) Where a person, in relation to whom byssinosis is prescribed by virtue of the amendment of regulation 2 of the principal regulations made by regulation 2 of these regulations, is suffering from a loss of faculty as a result of byssinosis on the date on which these regulations come into operation, the provisions of regulation 6 of the principal regulations (date of development) shall be applied subject to the modification that the date on which these regulations come into operation shall be treated as the day on which he first suffered from the relevant loss of faculty, and the date of development shall be determined accordingly.

(2) Where a person to whom paragraph (1) above applies is awarded disablement benefit in respect of byssinosis and claims an increase of that benefit under section 60 of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975 (increase of disablement pension for special hardship) then, if at any time after having been employed as mentioned in regulation 2(c) of the principal regulations as amended by regulation 2 of these regulations but before the date on which these regulations come into operation that person has abandoned any occupation as a result of the disease, the fact that he has abandoned that occupation shall be disregarded in determining his regular occupation for the purposes of the said section 60.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations amend regulation 2 of the Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977 so that, for the purpose of deciding whether byssinosis is a prescribed disease in relation to a person, it is no longer necessary that he should have been employed for a specific minimum period in an occupation prescribed in relation to byssinosis. There are transitional provisions relating to persons covered by the amendment who are already suffering from the disease when the regulations come into operation.
