The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1980

Made 28th August 1980 24th November 1980 Coming into operation

Whereas the Secretary of State for Social Services has made an order(a) under sections 124 and 126A of the Social Security Act 1975(b) and section 23(1) of the Social Security Pensions Act 1975(c):

Now, therefore, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 120 of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(d) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and in conjunction with the Department of Finance for Northern Ireland(e), hereby makes the following order(f):

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1980 and shall come into operation on 24th November 1980.
 - (2) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "the Act" means the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975, and
 - "the Pensions Order" means the Social Security Pensions (Northern Ireland) Order 1975(g).

Alteration in rates or amounts of certain benefits under the Act

- 2.—(1) In this Article, "Schedule 4" means Schedule 4 to the Act(h).
- (2) The sums specified in paragraph (3) below shall be altered from and including the respective dates specified in Article 4 below; and Schedule 4 shall accordingly have effect as set out in the Schedule to this order.
- (3) The sums mentioned in paragraph (2) above are the sums specified in Parts I, III, IV and V of Schedule 4 (contributory periodical benefits, non-contributory periodical benefits, increases of benefits for dependants and rate or amount of industrial injuries benefits, respectively), except the sum specified in the said Part III for age addition.

Increase in rates or amounts of certain benefits under the Pensions Order

- 3.—(1) The sums mentioned in paragraphs (2) to (5) below shall be increased from and including the respective dates specified in Article 4 below.
- (2) In Article 8(1)(a) of the Pensions Order (basic component of Category A retirement pension) for the sum of £23.30 there shall be substituted—
 - (a) so far as the sum is relevant for the purpose of calculating under section 14(6) of the Act the rate of unemployment or sickness benefit and of calculating under section 15(4) of the Act or Article 16, 17 or 18 of the Pensions Order the rate of an invalidity pension, the sum of £26.00; and
 - (b) except so far as mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) above, the sum of £27.15.
- (3) It is hereby directed that the sums which are the additional components in the rates of long-term benefits calculated by reference to any final relevant year earlier than the tax year 1980/1981 shall be increased by 16.5 per cent. of their amount apart from this order.
- (4) It is hereby directed that the sums payable by way of increases of retirement pensions under Schedule 1 to the Pensions Order (increase of pension where pensioner defers retirement) shall be increased by 16.5 per cent.
 - (5) It is hereby directed that an amount equal to 16.5 per cent. of—
 - (a) the aggregate amount of the sums payable to a person by virtue of Article 37(6) of the Pensions Order (which provides for increases in a person's guaranteed minimum pension if payment of his occupational pension is postponed after he attains pensionable age), including such sums which are payable by virtue of Article 38(3) of that Order; and
 - (b) the amount by which that person's Category A or Category B retirement pension has been increased by an order under section 120 of the Act corresponding to an order made by the Secretary of State under section 126A of the Social Security Act 1975 by virtue of sub-section 1(b) of that section (up-rating of increments in guaranteed minimum pensions),

but excluding, in either case, any increases under Schedule 1 to the Pensions Order which are increased by paragraph (4) above, shall be payable by way of an increase of his Category A or Category B retirement pension.

Dates on which sums specified for rates or amounts of benefit under the Act or the Pensions Order are altered by this order

- 4.—(1) Subject to paragraph (8) of this Article, the alterations made by this order in the sums specified for rates or amounts of benefit under the Act or the Pensions Order shall take effect for each case on the date specified in relation to such case in the following provisions of this Article.
- (2) In relation to the case of a person over pensionable age who has not retired from regular employment and for whom the rate of unemployment benefit, sickness benefit or invalidity pension falls to be calculated in accordance with section 14(6) or 15(4) of the Act, the increases in the sums mentioned in Articles 2, 3 and 6 for Category A and B retirement pension and graduated retirement benefit (together with, where appropriate, increases for dependants) shall take effect on 27th November 1980 and in relation to all other cases the increases in such sums shall take effect on 24th November 1980.
- (3) The increase mentioned in Article 3(5) shall take effect on 24th November 1980.
- (4) The alterations in the amounts of maternity allowance, widow's allowance, widowed mother's allowance, widow's pension, Category C and D retirement pension, child's spècial allowance, attendance allowance, invalid care allowance

(except in a case where the Department has made arrangements for it to be paid on a Wednesday), guardian's allowance and industrial death benefit by way of widow's and widower's pension and allowance in respect of children (together with, where appropriate, increases for dependants) shall in all cases take effect from 24th November 1980.

- (5) The sums specified for the rate of mobility allowance, invalid care allowance (in a case where the Department has made arrangements for it to be paid on a Wednesday), disablement benefit (together with increases of disablement pension), maximum disablement gratuity under section 57(5) of the Act, increase of unemployability supplement under section 59 of the Act and maximum, under section 91(1) of the Act, of aggregate of weekly benefit payable for successive accidents, shall be increased in all cases with effect from 26th November 1980.
- (6) In relation to the case of a person whose weekly rate of Category A or B retirement pension falls to be increased under the provisions of section 28(7) or 29(8). of the Act by reference to the weekly rate of invalidity allowance to which he was previously entitled, the increase in the sum specified for the appropriate rate of invalidity allowance shall take effect on 24th November 1980 and in relation to all other cases the increase in such sum shall take effect on 27th November 1980.
- (7) The alterations in the rates or amounts of unemployment and sickness benefit, invalidity pension, non-contributory invalidity pension and injury benefit (together with, where appropriate, increases for dependants), shall take effect in all cases on 27th November 1980.
- (8) In the case of a person to whom injury benefit under the Act is payable for 26th November 1980 at a reduced weekly rate by virtue of the provisions of section 91(1) of the Act (maximum aggregate of weekly benefit payable for successive accidents), the rate of that benefit or of any sickness benefit or invalidity pension under the Act or the Pensions Order shall be determined as if the alteration in the rates of those benefits took effect on 26th November 1980 and, where appropriate, as if the reference to 27th November 1980 in paragraph (2) of this Article were a reference to 26th November 1980.

Increase in rate of benefit under the Industrial Injuries and Diseases (Northern Ireland Old Cases) Act 1975

5. With effect from and including 26th November 1980, for "£14.00" there shall be substituted "£16·30" in section 2(6)(c) of the Industrial Injuries and Diseases (Northern Ireland Old Cases) Act 1975(i) (maximum weekly rate of lesser incapacity allowance supplementing workmen's compensation).

Increase in rate of graduated retirement benefit and increments thereof

- 6.—(1) In the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(i) the sum of 3.04 pence referred to in section 35(1) (graduated retirement benefit) shall be increased by 16.5 per cent.; and from and including 24th November 1980 the reference in that provision to that sum shall accordingly have effect as a reference to 3.54 pence.
- (2) It is hereby directed that the aggregate amount of any increases of graduated retirement benefit payable under Schedule 2 to the Social Security (Graduated Retirement Benefit) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978(k) (increases for deferred retirement) shall be increased by 16.5 per cent.

- 7. There are hereby revoked—
- (a) the Social Security (Mobility Allowance) Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1978(I), and
- (b) in the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1979(m), the reference to the Pensions Order in Article 1, and the whole of Articles 2 to 6 and the Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This order, which corresponds to an order made by the Secretary of State for Social Services under sections 124 and 126A of the Social Security Act 1975 and section 23(1) of the Social Security Pensions Act 1975 alters with effect from specified dates in the week beginning 24th November 1980 the rates and amounts of the benefits and increases of benefit (except age addition) specified in Parts I, III, IV and V of Schedule 4 to the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975; the rates and amounts of certain benefits under Part III of the Social Security Pensions (Northern Ireland) Order 1975 (including increases of Category A or B retirement pension payable by reference to the increases of increments in guaranteed minimum pensions payable by virtue of Article 37(6) of that Order), and the rate of graduated retirement benefit under the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1966.

The order also increases the maximum weekly rate of lesser incapacity allowance supplementing workmen's compensation laid down in the Industrial Injuries and Diseases (Northern Ireland Old Cases) Act 1975.
