ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

One-Way Traffic (Ballymoney) Order (Northern Ireland) 1980

Made 15th September 1980

Coming into operation 27th October 1980

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 19 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Ballymoney) Order (Northern Ireland) 1980 and shall come into operation on 27th October 1980.

Prohibition

2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on the road or on the lengths of road specified in column 1 of the schedule in a direction other than that specified in relation to that road or lengths of road in column 2.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This order provides for one-way traffic systems in the town of Ballymoney.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the order have been erected on the roads.
