ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Prohibition of Traffic (Portstewart) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1981

Made 27th May 1981

Coming into operation 6th July 1981

The Department of the Environment being satisfied that the use of the length of road described in article 2 ought to be restricted for the purpose of facilitating the movement of pedestrian traffic on that length of road and after giving public notice of its intention in exercise of the powers conferred by article 22(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Prohibition of Traffic (Portstewart) Order (Northern Ireland) 1981 and shall come into operation on 6th July 1981.

Prohibition

2. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in that part of Station Road, Portstewart, from a point approximately 20 metres east of its junction with Central Avenue to a point approximately 39 metres east of that junction.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order prohibits vehicles from using that part of Station Road, Portstewart, from a point approximately 20 metres east of its junction with Central Avenue to a point approximately 39 metres east of that junction.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.
