ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

One-Way Traffic (Ballynahinch) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1981

Made 9th February 1981

Coming into operation 1st April 1981

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 19 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Ballynahinch) Order (Northern Ireland) 1981 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1981.

Prohibition

2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on the road specified in column 1 of the schedule in a direction other than that specified in relation to that road in column 2.

SCHEDULE

<i>Column 1</i>	<i>Column 2</i>
In the town of Ballynahinch, Co. Down. New entrance road from High Street to Car Park.	Westerly from High Street.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This order provides for a one-way traffic system on the new entrance road from High Street, Ballynahinch, to the car park.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the order will, in due course, be erected on the road.
