ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES**Control of Traffic (Bangor) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982**

Made 29th January 1982

Coming into operation 15th March 1982

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment (in this Order referred to as "the Department") is of the opinion that traffic should be prohibited from proceeding as described in Article 2;

AND WHEREAS notice has been published in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Control of Traffic (Bangor) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 and shall come into operation on 15th March 1982.

Prohibition of Right-hand turn

2. Subject to Article 3 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle proceeding on the road specified in column 1 of the schedule to make a right-hand turn into the roads specified in column 2 while proceeding in the direction specified in column 3.

Exemptions

3. Article 2 shall not apply to:—

- (a) vehicles used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (b) a vehicle, the driver of which is acting upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden.

Castle Street Bangor	Hamilton Road Lower Main Street	North westerly

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This order prohibits vehicles when proceeding in a north westerly direction along Castle Street, Bangor, from making a right-hand turn into Hamilton Road and into Lower Main Street, Bangor.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the order will, in due course, be erected on the road.
