INDUSTRIAL ASSURANCE

Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1982

Made . . . . . 19th March 1982

Coming into operation . . . . . 17th May 1982

The Department of Commerce, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Article 49(1)(a) and (b) of the Industrial Assurance (Northern Ireland) Order 1979(a) (hereinafter called "the Order") and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Department of Finance hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1982 and shall come into operation on 17th May 1982.

Fees

2.—(1) The fees specified in the second column of the Schedule shall be payable to the Department of Commerce in respect of the matters mentioned in the first column of the Schedule.

(2) The fees mentioned in paragraph (1) shall be payable in advance.

Revocation

3. The Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1981(b) are hereby revoked.

and for every additional £20 (or part of £20) claimed ...	1.50

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These Regulations provide for an increase of approximately 25% in the fees payable in connection with the exercise by the Industrial Assurance Commissioner of his functions under the Industrial Assurance (Northern Ireland) Order 1979 and for the inspection and the furnishing of copies or extracts of documents in his custody. These Regulations supersede the Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1981.
