**ULSTER SPECIAL CONSTABULARY
PENSIONS**

Ulster Special Constabulary Pensions (Amendment) Regulations 1983

Made 18th February 1983

Coming into operation 1st March 1983

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 1 of the Special Constables Act 1914(a) (as extended and amended by section 8 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland) 1922(b)), and section 4(4) of the Constabulary (Pensions) Act (Northern Ireland) 1949(c), read with section 33(2) of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(d) hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Ulster Special Constabulary Pensions (Amendment) Regulations 1983 and shall come into operation on 1st March 1983.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations “the principal regulations” means the Ulster Special Constabulary Pensions Regulations 1950(e).

Amount of long-term compensation payable for loss of emoluments

3. For paragraph 4(2)(a) of the Sixth Schedule to the principal regulations there shall be substituted the following provision:—

“(a) where he is not in employment, be equivalent to the annual rate of two-thirds of his annual emoluments in the Force, reduced by—

- (i) the annual rate of any sickness or industrial injuries benefit; or
- (ii) the annual rate of any unemployment benefit which is payable or would be payable but for any abatement of such benefit by any occupational pension; or
- (iii) any training grant from public funds to which he may be entitled, excluding any national insurance benefits claimable by him in respect of a dependant; or”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend the Sixth Schedule to the Ulster Special Constabulary Pensions Regulations 1950 to provide that for the purposes of the part of the Schedule relating to long-term compensation the calculation of unemployment benefit shall be unaffected by the payment of any occupational pension.
