WELFARE OF ANIMALS**Welfare of Animals (Scheduled Operations) (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1983**

Made 3rd October 1983

Coming into operation 14th November 1983

*To be laid before Parliament under paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 1 to the
Northern Ireland Act 1974*

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 14(3) of the Welfare of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1972(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Welfare of Animals (Scheduled Operations) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1983 and shall come into operation on 14th November 1983.

Amendment of the Welfare of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1972

2. In Schedule 1 to the Welfare of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 (operations which may be performed without an anaesthetic):—

- (a) in sub-paragraph 6(ii) (tail docking of pigs) for the words “fourth day” there shall be substituted “eighth day”;
- (b) in paragraph 7 (castration) for sub-paragraph (ii) there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—
 - “(ii) by any other means—
 - (a) in the case of a calf, goat or pig before the age of two months; and
 - (b) in the case of a lamb; before the age of three months.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends Schedule 1 to the Welfare of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 by extending from 4 days to 8 days the age before which a pig's tail may be docked without the use of an anaesthetic. The Order also reduces from 3 months to 2 months the maximum age limit at which a calf, goat or pig may be castrated without the use of an anaesthetic.
