Game Birds Preservation Order (Northern Ireland) 1985

Made 10th July 1985

Coming into operation 11th August 1985

The Department of the Environment(a), being satisfied that it is necessary to provide special protection for grouse, partridge, red-legged partridge and hen pheasants:

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 7C(1) and 7F of the Game Preservation Act (Northern Ireland) 1928(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and now vested in the Head of the Department of the Environment, and paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 1 to the Northern Ireland Act 1974(c) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf; and
- (b) after publishing, pursuant to section 7F(5) of the Act, notice of proposal to make this Order and the purport thereof and not having received any objection to the said proposal,

hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Game Birds Preservation Order (Northern Ireland) 1985 and shall come into operation on 11th August 1985.

Prohibition of sale for consumption of grouse

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or purchase grouse for consumption in Northern Ireland or elsewhere by human beings or animals at any time from 11th August 1985 to 11th August 1986.

Prohibition of shooting or taking of partridge

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to shoot or take partridge at any time from 30th September 1985 to 30th September 1986.

Prohibition of killing or taking of hen pheasants and red-legged partridges

4. It shall not be lawful for any person to kill or take hen pheasants or red-legged partridges from 30th September 1985 to 30th September 1986 provided that the Department of the Environment may, where it is considered expedient so to do, grant exemption from the terms of this Article.

Prohibition of sale for consumption of hen pheasants and red-legged partridges

5. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or purchase hen pheasants or red-legged partridges for consumption in Northern Ireland or elsewhere by human beings or animals at any time from 30th September 1985 to 30th September 1986,

except that a person who has been exempted under Article 4 to kill hen pheasants may sell them to a licensed game dealer.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order prohibits, except where exemption is granted, the killing or taking of hen pheasants and red-legged partridges during the normal open season for game birds. It also restricts dealings in hen pheasants and red-legged partridges, prohibits dealings in grouse and prohibits the shooting or taking of partridge.

Any person who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provision of the Order shall be guilty of an offence under the Game Preservation Act (Northern Ireland) 1928.

Any person guilty of an offence under the Act shall be liable on summary conviction in the case of a first offence to a fine not exceeding £50 and in the case of a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding £100 or at the discretion of the court to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
