**ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES****Control of Traffic (Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1985***Made* . . . . . 7th February 1985*Coming into operation* . . . . . 24th March 1985

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Traffic (Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1985 and shall come into operation on 24th March 1985.

*Compulsory left-hand turn*

2. A person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit a vehicle travelling in a southerly direction along Montgomery Street, Belfast, on reaching its junction with Chichester Street to make a left-hand turn into that street.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order provides for a compulsory left-hand turn into Chichester Street, Belfast, for vehicles travelling in a southerly direction along Montgomery Street.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £400. Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will, in due course, be erected on the road.
