## SOCIAL SECURITY

**The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations  
(Northern Ireland) 1985**

*Made* . . . . . 15th October 1985

*Coming into operation* . . . . . 25th November 1985

The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 17(1)(a), 58(3) and 126 of, and paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 14 to, the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations which contain only provisions in consequence of an order(b) under section 120 of the said Act of 1975:

*Citation, commencement and interpretation*

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1985 and shall come into operation on 25th November 1985.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“the Act” means the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975;

“the up-rating order” means the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1985(c);

and any reference in a regulation to a numbered paragraph is a reference to the paragraph of that regulation bearing that number.

*Conditions relating to payment of additional benefit under awards made before the appointed or prescribed day*

2.—(1) This regulation applies to a case where—

(a) either—

(i) an award of any benefit under Chapters I to III of Part II of the Act has been made before the day appointed or prescribed for the payment of the benefit in question at a higher rate provided in or by virtue of the up-rating order, or

(ii) an award of any benefit under Part II of the Act has been made before the day appointed or prescribed for the payment of the benefit in question at a lower rate provided in or by virtue of the up-rating order;

(b) the period to which the award relates has not ended before that day; and

(c) the award does not, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 2(2) of Schedule 14 to the Act, provide for the payment of the benefit at the higher or lower rate (as the case may be) as from that day.

(2) In a case to which this regulation applies, paragraphs 1 and 2 of Schedule 14 to the Act shall have effect subject to the condition that if a question arises as to either—

- (a) the weekly rate at which the benefit is payable by virtue of the up-rating order; or
- (b) whether the conditions for the receipt of the benefit at the altered rate are satisfied,

the benefit shall, until the question has been determined in accordance with the provisions of the Act, be or continue to be payable at the weekly rate specified in paragraph (3).

(3) The weekly rate referred to in paragraph (2) is the weekly rate specified in the award or the weekly rate at which the benefit would have been paid if the question had not arisen, whichever is the lower.

*Persons not ordinarily resident in Northern Ireland*

3. Regulation 5 of the Social Security Benefit (Persons Abroad) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978(a) (application of disqualification in respect of up-rating of benefit) shall apply to any additional benefit payable by virtue of the up-rating order.

*Amendment of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984*

4. Regulation 3 of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984(b) (persons deemed to be incapable of work) shall be further amended by the substitution in paragraph (3) for “£23·50” of “£25·00”.

*Amendment of the Social Security (General Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984*

5. Regulation 14 of the Social Security (General Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984(c) (earnings level for the purpose of unemployment supplement) shall be further amended by the substitution for “£1,222” of “£1,300”.

*Revocation*

6. The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984(d) are hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These regulations are made in consequence of the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1985 ("the up-rating order") and accordingly, by virtue of section 10(2) of, and paragraph 12(2) of Schedule 3 to, the Social Security Act 1980 (c. 30) are not subject to the requirement of section 10(1) of that Act for prior reference to the Social Security Advisory Committee.

Regulation 2 provides that in certain cases where a question has arisen about the effect of the up-rating order on a benefit already in payment the altered rates will not apply until the question is determined by an adjudicating authority.

Regulation 3 applies the provisions of regulation 5 of the Social Security Benefit (Persons Abroad) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978 so as to restrict the application of the increases specified in the up-rating order in cases where the beneficiary lives abroad.

Regulation 4 raises from £23.50 to £25.00 the earnings limit which applies to those undertaking work in certain circumstances while receiving sickness or invalidity benefit.

Regulation 5 raises from £1,222 to £1,300 a year the earnings limit which applies to unemployment supplement.

Regulation 6 revokes the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984.
