WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Newtownabbey) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986 and shall come into operation on 24th February 1986.

Revocation

2. The One-Way Traffic (Belfast-Newtownabbey) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982(b) in so far as it relates to roads in Newtownabbey is revoked.

Prohibition

3. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on the roads or on the lengths of road specified in column 1 of the Schedule in a direction other than that specified in relation to those roads or lengths of road in column 2.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order re-enacts the provisions in relation to roads in Newtownabbey specified in Schedule 2 to the One-Way Traffic (Belfast-Newtownabbey) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (S.R. 1982 No. 157).

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £400.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order have been erected on the roads.
