Sheep Scab (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1987

<i>Made</i>	<i>14th May 1987</i>
<i>Coming into operation</i>	<i>14th June 1987</i>

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 5(1), 19 and 60(1) of the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Sheep Scab (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1987 and shall come into operation on 14th June 1987.

Amendment of the Sheep Scab Order (Northern Ireland) 1970

2. The Sheep Scab Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(b) shall be amended as follows—

(a) in Article 3 after the definition of “constable” there shall be inserted—

“dipping period” means each of the dipping periods prescribed in Article 12;

“dipped” means dipped in accordance with the provisions of Article 13;”;

(b) for paragraph (1) of Article 12 there shall be substituted—

“12.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2) the owner or person in charge of any sheep shall cause all sheep in his possession to be dipped each year during the following periods—

(a) 14th June to 15th August; and

(b) 14th September to 15th November.”;

(c) for Article 14 there shall be substituted—

“*Restrictions on movement of sheep during a dipping period*

14.—(1) Subject to paragraphs (4) and (5) a person shall not in the period 17th June to 15th August or the period 17th September to 15th November move any sheep—

(a) away from the land on which they are normally kept; or

(b) into any fair, market, saleyard or place of private sale unless such sheep are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner or agent authorised in his behalf in the Form H in the Schedule.

(2) Sheep which are purchased at a fair, market, saleyard or private sale during the period 14th June to 17th June or the period 14th September to 17th September other than for the purpose of immediate slaughter and which are not accompanied by a declaration in the Form H in the Schedule shall be dipped by the purchaser within 7 days of purchase and shall until they are so dipped be isolated by the purchaser from all other sheep.

(3) Where during a dipping period, sheep purchased at a fair, market, saleyard or private sale have already been dipped such sheep shall not be permitted to come into contact with any undipped sheep on the purchaser's premises, and if such contact should occur the sheep purchased shall be deemed to be undipped and the owner shall be required to have them dipped together with the undipped sheep.

(4) The provisions of paragraph (1) shall not apply to sheep which are being moved away from the land on which they are normally kept directly to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter.

(5) The provisions of paragraph (1) shall not apply to fat sheep which are being moved into any fair, market, saleyard or place of private sale during the period 17th June to 28th June or the period 17th September to 28th September.

(6) The provisions of paragraph (2) shall apply to fat sheep purchased during the period 17th June to 28th June or the period 17th September to 28th September as they apply to sheep not intended for immediate slaughter which are purchased during the period 14th June to 17th June or the period 14th September to 17th September.

(7) During the period 17th June to 28th June and period 17th September to 28th September—

(a) the owner, occupier or person in charge of any fair, market, saleyard or place of private sale shall provide suitable facilities for the separation of undipped fat sheep and dipped sheep moved into or exposed for sale in that fair, market, saleyard or place of private sale; and

(b) where any undipped fat sheep and dipped sheep use the same passageway or sale ring in that place the owner, occupier or person in charge of that place shall after each occasion on which it is used by undipped fat sheep and before it is used by dipped sheep cleanse and disinfect that passageway or sale ring with an approved sheep dip.

(8) The owner or person in charge of any undipped fat sheep which are moved into or exposed for sale in any fair, market, saleyard or place of private sale shall not permit such sheep to come into contact with any dipped sheep in that place.

(9) Where any contact as is mentioned in paragraph (8) occurs between undipped fat sheep and dipped sheep, the dipped sheep shall be deemed to be undipped and the owner of such sheep shall be required to have them dipped."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the Sheep Scab Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 (“the 1970 Order”) by adding further provisions for the control and prevention of sheep scab.

Article 2(b) of this Order amends the 1970 Order by requiring sheep to be dipped each year during the periods 15th June to 15th August inclusive and 15th September to 15th November inclusive. Article 2(c) substitutes a new Article for Article 14 of the 1970 Order. The new Article 14 prohibits, subject to certain exceptions, the movement of sheep off the land on which they are normally kept or into any fair, market, saleyard or place of private sale during the periods 18th June to 15th August inclusive and 18th September to 15th November inclusive unless such sheep are accompanied by a declaration in the Form H in the Schedule to the 1970 Order signed by the owner or his agent.

The new Article 14 also includes provision—

- (a) prescribing the isolation and dipping of sheep purchased other than for the purpose of immediate slaughter during the periods 15th to 17th June inclusive and 15th to 17th September inclusive, and fat sheep purchased during the periods 18th to 28th June inclusive and 18th to 28th September inclusive;
- (b) for preventing contact between dipped and undipped sheep and prescribing re-dipping where such contact occurs; and
- (c) providing for the cleansing and disinfection of premises used for sales of dipped and undipped sheep.

Any person who without lawful authority or excuse, proof of which shall lie on him, contravenes any provision of this Order is guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981. A person guilty of such an offence is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £2,000 or in the case of an offence committed with respect to more than five animals not exceeding £400 for each animal.
