ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Urban Clearways (Londonderry) (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1988

Made 21st June 1988

Coming into operation 7th August 1988

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Urban Clearways (Londonderry) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1988 and shall come into operation on 7th August 1988.

Amendment

2. The Schedule to the Urban Clearways (Londonderry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986(b) shall be amended by:—

- (1) the deletion from the Schedule of the items relating to Bond's Hill, Clooney Terrace and Simpson's Brae, Londonderry.
- (2) The addition of the following items:—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This order deletes the clearway restrictions relating to Bond's Hill, Clooney Terrace and Simpson's Brae and prohibits the waiting of vehicles in Glendermott Road, from Monday to Friday inclusive between the hours of 8.30 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. and in Mill Street and King Street, on all days and at all times.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the order will be erected on the roads.
