

1988 No. 438**POLICE****Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions
(Amendment) Regulations 1988**

Made *7th December 1988*

Coming into operation *1st January 1989*

To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 25 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority for Northern Ireland and the Police Association for Northern Ireland, and, in accordance with section 2(3) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(b), the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom, hereby, with the concurrence of the Treasury, makes the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions (Amendment) Regulations 1988 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1989.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations any reference to “the principal regulations” is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions Regulations 1988(c).

Supplementary provisions

3. For paragraph (b) of regulation A2 of the principal regulations there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(b) the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions (War Service) Regulations 1980(d) and the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions (War Service) (Transferees) Regulations 1986(e) as amended by regulations 7 and 8 of the supplementary regulations.”.

Transfer values payable under interchange arrangements

4. In regulation F8(3)(c) of the principal regulations for the words “1979” there shall be substituted the words “1970”.
