## POLICE

**Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions  
(Amendment No. 3) Regulations 1989**

*Made* . . . . . 21st April 1989  
*Coming into operation* . . . . . 1st June 1989  
*To be laid before Parliament*

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 25 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority and the Police Association and, in accordance with section 2(3) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(b), the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom, hereby, with the concurrence of the Treasury, makes the following regulations:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions (Amendment No. 3) Regulations 1989 and shall come into operation on 1st June 1989.

*Interpretation*

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions Regulations 1988(c).

*Pensionable and average pensionable pay*

3. In regulation G1(1) of the principal regulations there shall be added at the end the following provision:—

“Provided that, in the case of a person by whom pension contributions become payable under regulation G2 on or after 1st June 1989, no account shall be taken, for the purposes of determining his pensionable pay, of any amount by which that rate exceeds £60,000.

In this paragraph a reference to contributions becoming payable is a reference to their becoming payable either for the first time or following any period in respect of which they were not payable.”
