**One-Way Traffic (Belfast) (Amendment No. 2)
Order (Northern Ireland) 1989***Made* 4th July 1989*Coming into operation* 10th September 1989

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Belfast) (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1989 and shall come into operation on 10th September 1989.

Amendment

2. Schedule 2 of the One-Way Traffic (Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986(b) shall be amended by the addition thereto of the following items—

<i>Column 1</i>	<i>Column 2</i>
Camden Street.	Easterly from Lisburn Road.
Claremont Street.	Westerly from University Road.
Link Road from Norglen Parade to Springfield Road.	Northerly from Norglen Parade to Springfield Road.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the provisions of the One-Way Traffic (Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986.

The amendment provides for the introduction of one-way traffic in Camden Street, Claremont Street and on the Link Road from Norglen Parade to Springfield Road, Belfast.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the roads.
