ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

**One-Way Traffic (Downpatrick) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1989**

Made *1st November 1989*

Coming into operation *17th December 1989*

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Downpatrick) Order (Northern Ireland) 1989 and shall come into operation on 17th December 1989.

Prohibition

2. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on St. Dillons Avenue, Downpatrick, from its junction with John Street at a point approximately 69 metres north-west of the John Street/Ardglass Road junction to its junction with Edward Street other than in a north-easterly direction from John Street.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order provides for the introduction of a one-way system of traffic in part of St. Dillons Avenue, Downpatrick.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the roads.
