**Royal Ulster Constabulary Fund (Amendment)  
Regulations 1989**

*Made . . . . . 9th November 1989*

*Coming into operation . . . . . 29th December 1989*

*To be laid before Parliament*

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 28 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and after consulting the Police Authority and the Police Association, hereby makes the following regulations:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Fund (Amendment) Regulations 1989 and shall come into operation on 29th December 1989.

*Interpretation*

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Fund Regulations 1972(b).

*Payments from the Fund*

3. In paragraph (b) of regulation 8 of the principal regulations there shall be inserted after the words “benefit of members” the words “or former members”, after the word “widows,” the word “widowers,” and after the words “deceased members” the words “or deceased former members”.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These regulations amend the Royal Ulster Constabulary Fund Regulations 1972.

Regulation 3 expands regulation 8(b) of the principal regulations so that payments from the RUC Fund may now be made for the benefit of members or former members of the police force or their families or the widows, widowers, children and dependants of deceased members or deceased former members.
