One-Way Traffic (Lisburn) (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1990

Made . . 6th September 1990 Coming into operation 28th October 1990

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 2(2)(b) and 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Lisburn) (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1990 and shall come into operation on 28th October 1990.

Amendment

2. The One-Way Traffic (Lisburn) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982(c) shall be amended by the addition to Schedule 1 of the following item—

Column 1	Column 2
Smithfield Square East.	Anti-clockwise from its easterly junction with Smithfield Street.

Revocation

3. The One-Way Traffic (Lisburn) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1990(**d**) is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the provisions of the One-Way Traffic (Lisburn) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982.

The amendment provides for one-way traffic in Smithfield Square East, Lisburn, and revokes the One-Way Traffic (Lisburn) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1990 because of an error in Article 2 of that Order.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
