Sheep Improvement (Amendment) Scheme  
(Northern Ireland) 1990

Made . . . . . 29th November 1990

Coming into operation . . . . . 7th January 1991

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 9 of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Department of Finance and Personnel(b), hereby makes the following Scheme:

*Citation and commencement*

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Sheep Improvement (Amendment) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1990 and shall come into operation on 7th January 1991.

2. The Sheep Improvement Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1988(c) shall be amended as follows:

(1) In Article 5, paragraph (2) there shall be substituted—

“For the purposes of paragraph (1)(a)(i) the owner of a flock, being a recording flock, shall not be required to furnish such evidence where the Department is satisfied that the veterinary health status of the flock has not altered in the recording year preceding that to which the application relates.”, and

(2) The existing paragraph (2) shall be re-numbered (3).

*(This note is not part of the Scheme.)*

This Scheme amends the Sheep Improvement Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1988 by removing the requirement that owners of recording flocks must annually furnish written evidence from a veterinary surgeon that the sheep are free from such diseases as the Department may determine and that they exhibit no physical defects.

Henceforward such certification will no longer be required where the Department is satisfied that the veterinary health of a previously certified flock has not altered in the recording year preceding that to which the application relates.
