**Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time)  
(Appointment and Conditions of Service)  
(Amendment No. 4) Regulations 1990**

*Made* . . . . . 30th November 1990

*Coming into operation* . . . . . 22nd January 1991

*To be laid before Parliament*

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 26 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(b), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority and the Police Association, hereby with the concurrence of the Treasury makes the following regulations:—

*Citation, operation and effect*

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Appointment and Conditions of Service) (Amendment No. 4) Regulations 1990.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on 22nd January 1991 but shall have effect for the purposes of regulations 3, 4 and 5 as on and from 1st September 1989.

*Interpretation*

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Appointment and Conditions of Service) Regulations 1988(c).

*Overtime*

3.—(1) Regulation 22 of the principal regulations shall be amended as follows:—

- (a) in paragraph (1) there shall be inserted after the words “two tours of duty” the words “or which forms part of a tour of duty which he is required to begin earlier than the rostered time without due notice and on a day when he has already completed his normal period of duty”;

(b) in paragraph (7)—

- (i) there shall be inserted at the beginning of sub-paragraph (b) the words “subject to sub-paragraph (d),”;
  - (ii) the word “and” at the end of sub-paragraph (b) shall be omitted, and
  - (iii) there shall be added after sub-paragraph (c) the following provision—
    - “; and
    - (d) where the time at which a member is required to begin a rostered tour of duty is brought forward without due notice and so that he is required to begin that tour on a day on which he has already completed his normal daily period of duty, the time for which he is on duty before the rostered commencement time—
      - (i) shall be reckonable as overtime, and
      - (ii) shall be taken into account as part of that tour of duty”; and
- (c) in paragraph 8 there shall be inserted after the definition of a “day’s pay” the following provision—  
“ “due notice” means notice given at least 8 hours before the revised starting time of the rostered tour of duty in question;”.

#### *Pay*

4.—(1) There shall be substituted for the table in Schedule 3 to the principal regulations the Table set out in the Schedule.

(2) Paragraph 1A of Schedule 3 shall be omitted.

#### *Dog handler’s allowance*

5. In Schedule 9 to the principal regulations in paragraph 1(1) for “£663” there shall be substituted “£723”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These regulations amend the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Appointments and Conditions of Service) Regulations 1988 (the principal regulations) with effect, as provided by regulation 1, from 22nd January 1991 but for the purposes of regulations 3, 4 and 5 shall have effect as on and from 1st September 1989.

Retrospection is authorised by section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962.

Regulation 3 provides for the payment of overtime in specified circumstances where the beginning of an officer's tour of duty is brought forward.

Regulation 4 increases the rates of pay for members of the force.

Regulation 5 increases the dog handler's allowance.
