ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Control of Traffic (Bangor) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1991

Made 24th September 1991

Coming into operation 11th November 1991

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 2(2)(b) and 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Traffic (Bangor) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 and shall come into operation on 11th November 1991.

Prohibition

2. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to enter that part of Queen's Parade, Bangor, from its junction with Gray's Hill to its junction with Somerset Avenue, known locally as The Kinnegar, from the roundabout at the junction of Gray's Hill, Queen's Parade and Southwell Road.

This Order prohibits vehicles from entering that part of Queen's Parade, Bangor, from its junction with Gray's Hill to its junction with Somerset Avenue, known locally as The Kinnegar, from the roundabout at the junction of Gray's Hill, Queen's Parade and Southwell Road.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the roads.
