**Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1991**

Made 10th December 1991

Coming into operation 11th December 1991

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 1(1) and 24(3) of the Food and Environment Protection Act 1985(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, being of the opinion in accordance with section 1(1) of that Act that there exist or may exist circumstances which are likely to create a hazard to human health through human consumption of food and that in consequence food which is or may be in the future derived from sheep in the areas described in the Schedule to the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991(b), is, or may be, or may become, unsuitable for human consumption, hereby makes the following Order:—

Title, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 and shall come into operation on 11th December 1991.

(2) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954(c) shall apply to this Order as it applies to a Measure of the Northern Ireland Assembly.

Amendment

2. The area in Glenshane, County Londonderry, described in the Schedule to the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 shall be substituted by the area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Glenshane, County Londonderry

The area comprising those parts of County Londonderry which lie within the following boundary:—

From the junction of the Lisnamuck Road and the Glenshane Road (OS Map Ref. C796016) eastwards along the Glenshane Road to OS Map Ref. C806013; north east along the Ranaghan Road to OS Map Ref. C819020; north along the Seefin Road and Seefin Hill Road to OS Map Ref. C815038; northwards along the Pollan Water to Tullykeeran Bridge (OS Map Ref. C818045); north along the Tirkane Road to OS Map Ref. C812049; west along fences and the Altree Burn which mark the townland boundary between Tullykeeran and Currudda on the one hand and Slaughterneill and Eden on the other to OS Map Ref. C773054; southwards along the River Roe which marks the townland boundary between Currudda and Corick to OS Map Ref. C773043; westward along fences marking the townland boundary between Glenshane and Moydamlaght on the one hand and Corick, Cluntygeeragh and Moneyneany on the other to OS Map Ref. C738006; south along the boundary of Moydamlaght Forest to OS Map Ref. H750988; south along townland boundary separating Moydamlaght and Dunmurry to OS Map Ref. H754975; north east along field boundary to OS Map Ref. H755976; south east along river to OS Map Ref. H759975; east along Fivemilestraight Road to OS Map Ref. H763976; north along Dunmurry Road to OS Map Ref. H762977; north along field boundary to OS Map Ref. H761980; east along field boundary to OS Map Ref. H771983; south east along river to junction with Fivemilestraight Road OS Map Ref. H776980; east along Fivemilestraight Road to Campbells Bridge OS Map Ref. H794986; north along river to OS Map Ref. H790995; north and east along field boundary to OS Map Ref. H791997; east along field boundary to OS Map Ref. H797998; north along field boundary to OS Map Ref. H797000; north east along field boundary to river at OS Map Ref. C799001; north along stream to OS Map Ref. C796006; east along field boundary to Lisnamuck Hill Road at OS Map Ref. C798006; north along Lisnamuck Hill Road to Lisnamuck Road at OS Map Ref. C797011; north along Lisnamuck Road to junction with Glenshane Road at OS Map Ref. C796016.

The area excludes any part of a road, fence or river by reference to which its boundary is defined.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

The Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 (“the principal order”) contains emergency prohibitions on various activities in order to prevent human consumption of food which is derived from sheep in the designated areas in Northern Ireland and which has been or may have been rendered unsuitable for human consumption in consequence of the elevated levels of radioactivity found in those areas following the escape of radioactive substances from a nuclear reactor situated at Chernobyl in the USSR.

This Order amends the principal order by reducing the size of the designated area in Glenshane, County Londonderry.
