**The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations
(Northern Ireland) 1991**

Made 11th March 1991

Coming into operation 8th April 1991

The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 17(1)(a), 49(b), 58(3) and 126 of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(a) and Article 65(2) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Order 1986(b) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1991 and shall come into operation on 8th April 1991.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“the principal Act” means the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975;

“the 1986 Order” means the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Order 1986;

“the up-rating order” means the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1991(c);

and any reference in a regulation to a numbered paragraph is a reference to the paragraph of that regulation bearing that number.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1978(d) shall apply to these regulations as it applies to an Act of the United Kingdom Parliament.

Conditions relating to payment of additional benefit under awards made before the appointed or prescribed day

2.—(1) This regulation applies to a case where—

- (i) an award of any benefit under Chapters I to III of Part II of the principal Act has been made before the day appointed or prescribed for the payment of the benefit in question at a higher rate provided in or by virtue of the up-rating order, or
 - (ii) an award of any benefit under Part II of the principal Act has been made before the day appointed or prescribed for the payment of the benefit in question at a lower rate provided in or by virtue of the up-rating order;
- (b) the period to which the award relates has not ended before that day; and
- (c) the award does not, in accordance with the provisions of Article 65(3) of the 1986 Order, provide for the payment of the benefit at the higher or lower rate (as the case may be) as from that day.

(2) In a case to which this regulation applies, Article 65(2) of the 1986 Order shall have effect subject to the condition that if a question arises as to either—

- (a) the weekly rate at which the benefit is payable by virtue of the up-rating order; or
- (b) whether the conditions for the receipt of the benefit at the altered rate are satisfied,

the benefit shall, until the question has been determined in accordance with the provisions of the principal Act, be or continue to be payable at the weekly rate specified in paragraph (3).

(3) The weekly rate referred to in paragraph (2) is the weekly rate specified in the award or the weekly rate at which the benefit would have been paid if the question had not arisen, whichever is the lower.

Persons not ordinarily resident in Northern Ireland

3. Regulation 5 of the Social Security Benefit (Persons Abroad) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978(a) (application of disqualification in respect of up-rating of benefit) shall apply to any additional benefit payable by virtue of the up-rating order.

Amendment of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984

4. In regulation 3(3) of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984(b) (persons deemed to be incapable of work) for “£35.00” there shall be substituted “£39.00”.

Amendment of the Social Security (General Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984

5. In regulation 14 of the Social Security (General Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984(c) (earnings level for the purpose of unemployability supplement) for “£1,820” there shall be substituted “£2,028”.

Earnings limit

6. The sums specified in paragraph 2B of Schedule 2 to the Social Security Benefit (Dependency) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977^(a) (prescribed circumstances for increase of an invalid care allowance) shall be increased from £100, £13 and £100 to £110, £14 and £110 respectively.

Revocations

7. The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1990^(b) are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations correspond to provision contained in regulations made by the Secretary of State for Social Security in relation to Great Britain and accordingly, by virtue of section 10(2) of, and paragraph 21 of Schedule 3 to, the Social Security Act 1980 (c. 30), are not subject to the requirement of section 10(1) of that Act for prior reference to the Social Security Advisory Committee.

Regulation 2 provides that in certain cases where a question has arisen about the effect of the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 ("the up-rating order") on a benefit already in payment the altered rates will not apply until the question is determined by an adjudicating authority.

Regulation 3 applies the provisions of regulation 5 of the Social Security Benefit (Persons Abroad) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978 so as to restrict the application of the increases specified in the up-rating order in cases where the beneficiary lives abroad.

Regulation 4 raises from £35.00 to £39.00 the earnings limit which applies to those undertaking work in certain circumstances while receiving sickness or invalidity benefit.

Regulation 5 raises from £1,820 to £2,028 a year the earnings limit which applies to unemployability supplement.

Regulation 6 specifies earnings limits for child dependency increases payable with invalid care allowance.

Regulation 7 revokes the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1990.
