ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

**One-Way Traffic (Londonderry) (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1992**

Made 24th March 1992

Coming into operation 4th May 1992

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 2(2)(b) and 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Londonderry) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1992 and shall come into operation on 4th May 1992.

Amendment

2. The One-Way Traffic (Londonderry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1981(c) shall be amended by the addition to Schedule 2 of the items in the Schedule to this Order.

Messines Park, from its junction with Racecourse Road, to a point approximately 100 metres north-west of that junction	North-westerly from Racecourse Road
Messines Park, from a point approximately 220 metres north-east of its junction with Buncrana Road, to that junction	South-westerly towards Buncrana Road

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the provisions of the One-Way Traffic (Londonderry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1981.

The amendment provides for the introduction of one-way traffic in parts of Messines Park, Londonderry.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
